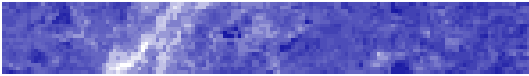


As a Parent Advisory Council, we work to promote understanding and cooperation between parents, teachers and the special education departments of Union 61.

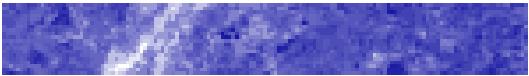
We facilitate communication within the community regarding special education and promote a general awareness of the disabilities that effect the education of our children.

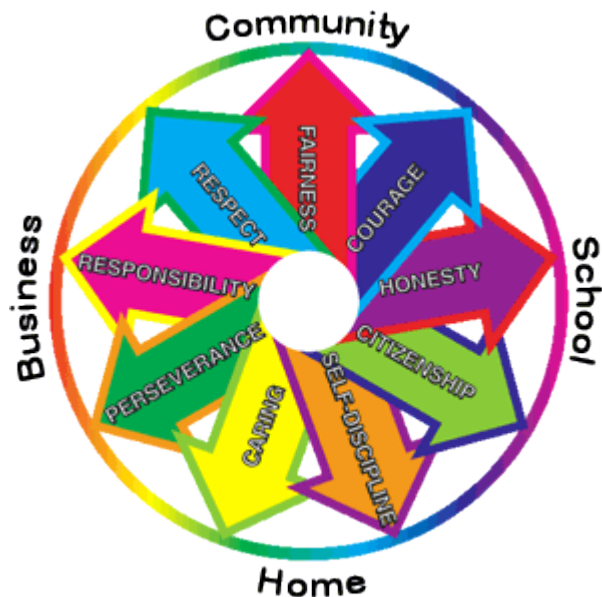
